

Suppose you had personally heard the "Sermon on the Mount" and had been to be the your Father which is in heaven is perfect." Would you have accepted the challenge?

When you first started singing or first heard sung the Primary song, "! Am a Child of God, "did it not occur to you that, according to the law of inheritance, if you were true and faithful you might some day become as God is?

The standards of the Church never change. They are always consistent with we stong the highest and most ennobling things that are expected of mankind. They dignify The lift upward. They perfect.

Our time in the mission field is a unique opportunity to begin a program of perfection. Here, as we study and understand the depths of the doctrine and learn what the requirements are for exaltation, we soon discover that perfection is the standard. And there are no exceptions.

Consider these questions: In what ways are you perfect? Have you attained perfection in your obedience to the Word of Wisdom? Are (were) you perfect in your payment of tithing? Are you perfect in your obedience to the standards of the Mission? Are you perfect in your love for the people? Are you perfect in your love and respect for your companion? Are you perfect in your performance according to the dission expectations of constant diligence? Are you perfectly honest? Are you perfectly moral in your thoughts and actions?

Perhaps like the writer you are not so perfect. But that is the state of things today. Tomorrow must be different. Supposing we follow the excellent example of Benjamin Franklin in his famous autobiography. We might well list our deficiencies and then over a period of time (digamos quince días) concentrate on each imperfection until we are able to change it to our list of perfections.

Noah (Gen. 6:9), Seth (EC 107:43), and Job (Job 1:1) are listed as perfect men. Alma says "there were many, exceeding great many" who had walked in the star path of perfect righteousness before the Lord (Alma 13:10-12).

The Lord says, "He that walketh in a perfect way, he shall serve me (Ps. 101:6).

#### Dear Fellow Missionaries:

As we all know, a great many of Christ's teachings were presented to us in the form of parables or comparisons so as to be more clearly and easily understood in terms of commonly known and understandable objects. For example, he compared the Church to a human body, the rich man to a camel, faith to a mustard seed and the work of salvation among the children of men to a business. And indeed, the work in which we are presently engaged is one of the biggest businesses which ever has been or ever will be established upon the face of the earth, that of saving souls.

Christ many times referred to his "being about his Father's business," but as all good business managers are aware, Christ knew that in order to bring about the salvation of mankind he would need assistant managers to help and therefore has asked each one of us to be His partners or associates in His "Father's business."

What a privilege! What an opportunity for growth and service! But what are we personally doing with this great opportunity which has been afforded us? These two years are only the beginning of a life time contract which we have each signed committing 100% of our time, talents and resources to the building up and the establishment of this business upon the earth. May we always remember the importance of our callings as missionaries and make a regular but truthful evaluation of our progress and effectiveness in order that we may be counted among the wise and industrious servants in our "Father's business."





## IDEAS FOR BETTER TEACHING

This page is designed to help us use better and more effective teaching methods. Perhaps, these ideas may help you in your missionary work and they may also give you other ideas to make your lessons more interesting. Elder Sterling W. Sill, Assistant to the Quorum of the Twelve, states that, "Imagination is one of God's most valuable gifts." Let's use our imagination in teaching our investigators more effectively.

- 1. Don't use, "? Está el señor?" or "? Sabe quienes somos?" But, consider these: "? Pedemos hablar con el señor?"; Quisiéramos hablar con el señor, por favor; "? Puede Ud. decir a los señores que estamos?"
- 2. Don't ruin the opportunity for the next Elders to get into a house by using harsh statements.
- 3. The Mormon Pavillion film or Search for Happiness could be shown to the investigators on a district basis. This is to say the Elders of a district would take their investigators to a central meeting place and show these films.
- 4. Make return visits to give lessons often--every other day or as soon as possible in order that the investigators do not forget the message of the previous lesson.
- 5. Don't expect an investigator an answer if you haven't already given an explanation of the answer-that's the way the plan is set up.



- 6. Tract with a new Book of Mormon, consider the following:
  Ask, "Do you believe in Christ?" "Would you want to hear and read the words of Christ if he were to talk to another nation or people other than what is found in the Bible?" (Handing them a Book of Mormon and saying), "Here are His words to the people in the Americas." Then explain to them that it is a new witness for Jesus Christ and give them a brief explanation of what the Book of Mormon contains or how we got it or about the coming of Christ to the Americas. Use your imagination.
- 7. When giving lessons, learn the names of all your investigators and call them Hermano Gómez, Hermana Méndez, etc.
- 8. Stress the importance of family prayer. Explain to them that "a family that prays together stays together".
- 9. Give your testimony when you are prompted by the Spirit, not as a routine.
  Your testimony is the most important thing you have.

In order to iniciate a better teaching program it is asked that two suggestions be submitted by each Elder monthly to the district leader. The best suggestions will be printed in the Avante.




